Thank you for taking the time to explore my passion and the stories I tell through design.

















#### Senior YR Project Skeches I







**Second Year Project on Atmospheres I** Focusing on the diverse range of destroyed interiors caused by external forces and the residents' reactions, which create unsettling, claustrophobic, yet mysterious sceneries.

Neither Istanbul (Izmit Earthquake, 1999, magnitude 7.6) nor Kahramanmaras (2023, magnitudes 7.8 and 7.5) could withstand the devastation. By February 15, 2023, over 35,400 lives were lost in Turkey, with tens of thousands injured. These earthquakes struck as most people slept, trapping many inside collapsing buildings. Deeply moved by this tragedy, I dedicated this project to exploring the atmosphere and emotions experienced by the people of Kahramanmaras, Hatay, Gaziantep, and Osmaniye.










Second Year Project on Atmospheres I The purpose of these drawings is to explore how materials—the objects that surround people-contribute to atmosphere. Given the conditions of the chosen site, analyzing a fully intact building is nearly impossible. Instead, the destroyed areas should be seen not as spaces broken into pieces but as newly created forms.

The building blocks, once stacked to form structures, now take on entirely new shapes and alignments. Materials that once symbolized a home, workplace, or hospital now evoke memories, emotions, or even things one wishes to forget. These drawings demonstrate that atmosphere is fluid, shifting as the arrangement of surrounding objects changes-transforming spaces of warmth and security into ones of unease and dread.








Second Year Project on Atmospheres I This model was created solely for critique and carries no aesthetic intentions. It draws inspiration from the phrase, "Someone's life hangs by a thread," which I believe reflects how victims must have felt watching their homes collapse. Seeing their long-time homes reduced to rubble raises questions about the safety and integrity of these buildings when first approved for construction.

The questioning of liability led me to create a model highlighting the structural weaknesses of such buildings, especially given reports that many lacked reconstruction permits. The disregard for human life by some constructors left me feeling deeply betrayed.

This model mimics poorly constructed buildings. It uses no external adhesives (e.g., glue, silicone, or tape) and stands independently. The materials on either side balance each other solely by weight. Its assembly required precision and minimal movements, much like a game of Jenga.





#### **READING AREA/SILENT ZONE**

This area is both closest to the book-case and the most secluded corner of the room. It is a modern reading nook designed to be slightly larger than a single seat, low to the ground, and elongated. To take advantage of the low ceiling and create an additional seating area other than the bed, there is a matching ottoman along-side a single lounge chair. A small circular side table is nearby, providing a hard surface for drinks or other items.

This area is also useful for guests, allowing sleepovers in the same room.


#### **ISLAND BED**

The bed has been designed as an island. The orientation of the bed has been changed since having the bed visible as soon as one enters the room is not preferred for privacy. Therefore, the right corner of the bed's headboard extends in an L shape, enclosing the head area and creating a private nook without being claustrophobic. The left side of the headboard remains straight.

Nightstands with table lamps are present on both sides. A round rug could be placed under the bed to contrast with the rectangular shape of the bed, creating a warmer and cozier atmosphere for the island-like bed.

#### **BOOKCASE & SHELVES**

The entire wall on the left side will be a bookcase, except for the slightly sloped area of the wall, which will be designed as a shelf. While awards, sculptures, pictures, Legos, etc. will be displayed on the shelf, the bookcase will surround these central shelves.



#### **TELEVISION UNIT & MIRRORED CLOSET**

The hidden TV unit will be positioned centrally, flanked by sliding-door wardrobes. A wide buffet with 4 or 5 drawers can be placed under the TV for folded clothes. The TV's doors will be designed to slide to one side, as shown in the next image, so the TV screen is not obstructed by the closet doors.

If the sliding wardrobes on both sides of the TV are mirrored, it will make the room appear more spacious while also providing large mirrors for the person to use.


### **Duran's House: Bedroom Renovation for a Young Adult I Freelance Project**


Redesigned and developed detailed AutoCAD plans for a young adult's bedroom, creating a contemporary and functional space tailored to the client's needs. The project involved reimagining the room layout, optimizing space utilization, and incorporating a modern aesthetic that reflects the client's personality and lifestyle.

#### L-SHAPED STUDY AREA

The L-shaped corner desk maximizes the use of space and receives the natural light in the room most directly. Since the sunlight will come in from the side, it will not disturb the person working at the desk.

The desk's height being shorter than the closet or bookcase system is also advantageous in terms of the light coming into the room.

#### **TV UNIT**

The TV will be mounted on a rotatable unit, allowing it to be angled towards both the Reading/Silent Zone and the bed.

#### **ISLAND BED**


To completely isolate the bed from the entrance, the bed will be fully reversed, creating a clear separation between the workspace and the sleeping area within the same room. This ensures 100% privacy and effectively compartmentalizes the space.













## Bibi's London: Shoe Shop Conversion to Lunch Spot I Freelance Project




Bruno Munari



Senior YR Project Process I Sketches on The Bar Unit for Asylum Chapel Renovation









